

NFBC will be hosting guest artist Jeanne Cosenza along with her husband Chris or our January 9th 2023 workshop. This is a great 2-for-1 deal with two incredible artists bringing their talents to our club.



This is something many of us are really excited for. This is the first time NFBC has ever had a Kusamono workshop!

Jeanne will be providing the material (Pots, minimum of 3 plants, soil and some moss). The costs of the workshop is an incredibly reasonable \$45. We have 19 people already signed up but Jeanne has agreed to add up to three more spots as long as you give

Even though participants are limited, to ensure Jeanne is able to provide enough material, we encourage EVERYONE to attend. The program is free for observers and it is amazing what you will be able to learn just listening to the discussion. Observers are also welcome to ask questions to help everyone learn.

Guest Speaker Biography

Jeanne has been passionately immersed in bonsai culture for more than six years, volunteering as program director for the Suncoast Bonsai Society, BSF District 5 Trustee and co-chair for this year's BSF Convention Exhibit. She has

participated in numerous workshops and studied under the nations top Kusamono, Shitakusa and Kokedama instructors.

Two years ago, as a BSF Exhibit assistant, Jeanne's reputation for making beautiful accents led to her being commissioned to make six Shitakusa displays for the exhibit. Her accent pieces drew such acclaim, it inspired BSF to create an award for the



discipline and kick started her remarkable journey into the world of Kusamono.



When Young Choe, arguably the nation's leading Kusamono authority, sought out someone to represent Florida for her special Kusamono exhibit at the 2021 U.S. National Bonsai Exhibition in New York, two names kept coming up: Martha Goff and Jeanne Cosenza.

All told, Jeanne made 10 Kusamono displays for New York, and when a handful of bonsai entries were forced to drop last-minute from

the exhibit due to Covid-19, Bill Valavanis used many of Jeanne's Kusamono to fill the void. Young was so enamored with one of the pieces that Jeanne gifted it to her, and Young promptly displayed it alongside Mary Madison's famous buttonwood at the National Bonsai and Penjing Museum at the U.S. Arboretum in Washington D.C.

In 2022, Jeanne won the Best Companion Award at the BSF Convention Exhibit and has given numerous demonstrations on Shitakusa, Kusamono and Kokedama.

Seasonal Advice

January is normally our coldest month and a quiet month for bonsai.

Tropical Trees - We shouldn't be doing any work on tropical trees. Our primary goal this month is protecting trees as temperatures drop below 45 for our most sensitive species (i.e., buttonwood, black olive, etc.) or the low 40's for other tropical trees. A frozen tropical tree will sustain serious damage that is sometimes fatal.

Deciduous Trees - These species need a winter dormancy period to remain healthy. Once deciduous trees have gone fully dormant it is a good time to do structural pruning since you can see the full winter silhouette and identify potential areas for improvement.

Conifers and Broadleaf Evergreen Trees – These species need a winter dormancy period to remain healthy. It is also time to begin preparing for repotting. Make sure you have the pots, soil, tools, you need once the repotting window begins later in the month.
