

Guest Speaker Biography

Andrew Giles is the owner of New World Bonsai, founded in 2013. He spent most of his youth in a suburb of Tampa tree climbing, exploring nature, and plundering the treasures of the soon to be developed orange groves. In college he serendipitously worked on a tree farm that also had bonsai and was soon struck by the art. He admittedly killed more trees in those first years than his college tuition cost and hopes to help others avoid this same learning approach.



In 2018 Andrew began his tutelage with Boon Manakitivipart a renowned bonsai teacher and practitioner. Boon carries the spirit of his great teacher Kihachiro Kamiya, the genius who stands alone in winning first place in every major bonsai category available to a Japanese professional. Boon's methods adhere to first principles thinking, practicing from the best, and cultivating his students into autodidacts.

Andrew is a self styled forever student and is excited to continue building his farm near

Spring Hill Florida with the pursuit of making top level bonsai one day. Only things

you are strongly emotionally connected to will you take care of for the rest of your life. As we are jettisoning toward a technological future, Andrew hopes to connect more with the natural. What discoveries remain hidden in the humble world of trees and what might we yet learn about of ourselves with these sublime companions?

Our annual holiday celebration was fantastic. The tree decorating contest is always a crowd pleaser and we were fortunate to be able to have a big potluck again this year. There was a little something for everyone and it brought joy to

our hearts and stomachs.





Seasonal Advice

January is normally our coldest month and a quiet month for bonsai. With cooler weather, water needs will diminish and trees should be watched to prevent the roots from staying too wet.

Tropical Trees - We shouldn't be doing any work on tropical trees. Our primary goal this month is protecting trees as temperatures drop below 45 for our most sensitive species (i.e., buttonwood, black olive, etc.) or the low 40's for other tropical trees. A frozen tropical tree will sustain serious damage that is sometimes fatal.

Deciduous Trees - These species need a winter dormancy period to remain healthy. Once deciduous trees have gone fully dormant it is a good time to do structural pruning since you can see the full winter silhouette and identify potential areas for improvement.

Conifers and Broadleaf Evergreen Trees – These species need a winter dormancy period to remain healthy. It is also time to begin preparing for repotting. Make sure you have the pots, soil, tools, you need once the repotting window begins later in the month.
